Ship-to-Stock: The Past and the Present

Dick Laford will be speaking to us about the how an alternative to incoming inspection, called "Ship to Stock", has helped develop partnerships with suppliers, improve quality performance, and cost for more than two decades. The concept of supply chain management as we know it today could not exist without the thinking that went into "Ship to Stock". Please join us for an interesting discussion of how Mr. Laford's ideas were shaped in part by Feigenbaum, Crosby, Juran, and Deming, and what this means to us today!

Richard Laford has become known for his down-to-earth, thought-provoking concepts on supplier quality. He currently is semi-retired. He has worked and consulted with such well-known companies as Abbott Laboratories, Digital Equipment Corporation, Nashua Corporation under the direction of Dr. W. Edwards Deming, Northern Telecom Canada limited, Pratt & Whitney Aircraft, Rolls Royce Limited, and Wang Laboratories, Inc.

Laford attended the University of Hartford, Connecticut, where he received his B.S. in Industrial Administration and his M.B.A. in Management Systems. As an international lecturer, he has addressed organizations such as The American Society for Quality, the European Organization for Quality, American Production and Inventory Control Society and the Purchasing Management Association. He also was a Professor for the State of New Hampshire.

Laford has authored "Ship-To-Stock: an Alternative to Incoming Inspection", the principal "how-to" text on reducing material acquisition costs by Total Quality Management. He has been a contributing author to several books and booklets; authored many articles and technical papers on supplier quality, the role of inspection, statistical process control and the Shipto-Stock program.

He is a Fellow member of the American Society for Quality (A.S.Q.), and served as the 1985-1987 chairman of the Customer-Supplier Division. He also holds credentials as an A.S.Q. Certified Quality Engineer, Certified Quality Auditor, Certified Quality Manager, and Certified Quality Technician.

#### "INTRODUCTION TO DESIGNED EXPERIMENTS (DOE) AND ANALYSIS OF VARIANCE (ANOVA)" SEMINAR

This 2-day seminar is designed to cover the fundamentals of Designed Experiments (DOE) and Analysis of Variance (ANOVA). It will provide participants with the skills necessary to successfully conduct and analyze Full Factorial and Fractional Factorial Designed Experiments. It will also provide the DOE information necessary for the CQE and CSSBB Exams. This seminar begins with an overview of scientific method and its role in effective business decisions and process improvement through experimentation. The purpose and types of designed experiments are discussed at this time, beginning with the identification of potentially important factors through team-based screening activities. The seminar next moves into the activities necessary to design and effective an efficient experiment. Basic DOE terminology is introduced and defined (randomization, blocking, replication, confounding, factorial designs, fraction factorial designs, etc.). The calculations and interpretations for single factor experiments, a full factorial experiment, and a fractional factorial experiment are covered in detail. All designs are worked inclass with sample data sets. The seminar concludes with an overview of other types of designed experiments and their purposes, such as nested, hierarchical and split-plot designs, to assist participants in identifying future DOE training interests. A brief discussion of Taguchi vs. classical designs is included for clarification purposes only. An extensive reference manual with all necessary statistical tables is provided (and can be used during any ASQ certification exam). There are no pre-requisites for the course, but basic high school level algebra is very helpful.

- B. SINGLE FACTOR EXPERIMENTS: Effective Applications, Analysis Techniques
- C. FULL FACTORIAL ANALYSIS OF VARIANCE: The Design of the Experiment, One-Factor Experiments vs. Two or More Factor Experiments, Designing and Conducting a Full Factorial Designed Experiment, Comparative Analysis with Normal Probability Plots, Cube Plots and Linear Graphs, Comparative Analysis with Analysis of Variance (ANOVA) (.05 F table provided) and t-tests, Using Computer Packages for ANOVA, Determination of Optimum Factor Settings, Interpreting Interaction Statistically and Graphically, Randomized Block Designs
- D. FRACTIONAL FACTORIAL DESIGNS: Definition of and Purpose for Fractional Factorial Designs, Screening to Reduce the Number of Factors, Experimental Design Matrix, Confounding in Fractional Factorial Designs, Creating Alias Sets, Assigning Treatments to Blocks using "Modulus 2" Arithmetic and "Group Theory", ANOVA with Fractional Factorial Designs, Experiments to Validate Experimental Results/Settings -Introduction to the concept of Hypothesis Testing
- E. OTHER ISSUES: Discussion of other Classical Experimental Designs (Nested, Hierarchical, Split-Plot, etc.), Brief Comparison of Classical DOE vs. Taguchi
