Main Speaker: Dr. Kenneth Stephens

<u>Summary</u>: The presentation is entitled, "Be a Qualitist", and will focus on the Human aspects of quality. While service and manufacturing enterprises must deal with the myriad of physical and system entities of their businesses, it is the human interface that is involved throughout them all and exerts great influences on their success or failure. The "Qualitist" concept explores categories, attitudes, practices, and characteristics of personal interrelationships that can lead to success and well-being and represents a unique approach for further promoting and establishing this significant aspect of Quality.

Speaker Bio: Dr. Kenneth Stephens has a BS in mechanical science from LeTourneau Technical Institute and a PhD in Applied and Mathematical Statistics from Rutgers. His career has included periods as a quality engineer and manager, as a process research manager, as a university professor at Georgia Tech, LeTourneau College, Texas, and USF/UCF, and as a technical adviser with the United Nations International Development Organization. He was an adviser on industrial development and quality control for UNIDO in India, Thailand, Nigeria, Turkey, Ethiopia, and Mauritius. He was Country Director of the UNIDO program in Pakistan from 1984 to 1987 and China from 1987 to 1990, and in the latter assignment he supervised 80 industrial development projects in UNIDO's largest country program and conducted seminars and workshops in a number of Chinese cities. From 1990 to 1993 he was a senior industrial development officer in the Institutional Infrastructure Branch at UNIDO headquarters in Vienna. He is a fellow of ASQ (since 1974), a CQE (since 1966) and a member for 58 years. He is an academician emeritus of IAQ and a member since 1984. He chairs the ASQ Freund-Marquardt Metal committee.
